Dear Friend,



Landscape Maintenance Professionals

winter weather brings some relief from our typically high temperatures, but it also requires a bit of patience. Those tropical plants and small palms that are cold damaged are best left as they are until we are past the last frost, which may not be until mid March. The dead tips of various plants will protect the live tissue underneath and may prevent further frost damage. It is also too early to determine the extent of damage.

On palms, even if the center frond looks damaged, there may be another bud underneath waiting to push out, which may take a couple of months to appear. So please be patient you don't want to cause more damage.

With regard to irrigation, once a week should be sufficient, unless you have new plantings. If the leaf blades of turf grass are fully extended open, they have enough water. It is always a good idea to probe the soil to know how deep the moisture is, and then program your irrigation timer accordingly. Applying only as much water as needed and this will help to provide a healthy landscape.
