Who You Gonna Call?

While we don't have a ghost problem in MPII, from time to time we might see things that make us want to call the police — which in our case, is the Pasco County Sheriff Office. Unfortunately, our residents are often calling the Clubhouse first. If you experience something that should be called in to the Sheriff's office, you should NOT call the Clubhouse. Rather, you should decide if it's an emergency, or a non-emergency. If it is an emergency, dial 911 immediately.

If it's not an emergency, but you want to reach the Sheriff Deputies, use the PCSO non-emergency number: 727-847-8102. This will get you in touch with a professional dispatcher, who knows what questions to ask and knows what information the Deputy will need when they respond. This also logs the call with the County, which is often very important. Also, they can reach the Deputy faster than the Clubhouse staff can. The bottom line is, if you feel the Sheriff Deputies need to be aware of a problem or need to respond to a problem, never call the Clubhouse, call either 911 or the non-emergency line at 727-847-8102.

A FEW WORDS FROM THE BOARD Sidewalk Repairs

As a reminder to residents, you may see yellow paint on sidewalks in Deer Run, Morningside, County Line Road, Beardsley Drive, or Mansfield Boulevard. These were painted and photographed in an effort to encourage Pasco County to repair these spots as they are potential trip hazards. While we continue working with the county, please use caution in areas where you see this paint. Also, the CDD is continuing to repair sidewalks that are owned and maintained by the CDD. During these repairs, affected areas will be marked and/or roped off for safety. If sidewalks near your property are repaired, please turn OFF your sprinklers until 3 days after the new sidewalk has set. Thank you.

Pond Repairs

In addition to sidewalk repairs, our Maintenance team is taking advantage of the mild temperatures before summer to do another round of pond repairs. We repair shorelines of ponds to repair and prevent erosion. MPII has well over 100 ponds, so an engineering firm was consulted to prioritize the repairs. Completing these repairs will protect homeowner property lines, keep the ecosystem stable, and maintain the aesthetic beauty that our ponds and conservation areas provide all our residents.

Presidential Primary

The MPII Clubhouse is also the local polling location for elections. On Monday, March 15th, the Clubhouse will be closed for the Presidential Preference Primary. This means several things to our residents. First, if you plan on voting in the Primary for your party, check your voter card, we are likely your polling location. Also, all residents, whether voting or not, should be prepared for additional traffic in and around the Clubhouse. Thirdly, while the fitness center, pool, and courts will be open, the Clubhouse itself (including all event rooms) will be closed all day. We apologize for the inconvenience and encourage you to vote!
